SJH Drivers For GS1 Adoption



Internal

- Patient Safety
- " Increase Supply Chain Efficiencies
- Patient Level Costing

External


- Increase in Product Recall
- Legislation (falsified medicines and medical devices (UDI)
- Policy Change (Money Follows Patient)
- " Drive for cost savings

The Australian Model

NEHTA and GS1 = NPC

- nehta
- **e**

- Lack of standardised product identification = GTIN
- Lack of standardised location identification = GLN



- Multiple product data catalogues being maintained per hospital, per hospital network and per state = NPC
- Inaccurate and inefficient procurement practice = eProcurement (GS1 XML)

Challenges in Irish Healthcare Many Pieces of Paper



The Paper Documents

- Purchase Order
- Despatch Note
- Proof of Delivery
- " Invoice
- Credit Note




Paper based, Manual processes

- Bad data leads to incorrect orders
- Time consuming Information is manually re-keyed by Supplier and Hospital multiple times
- " Risk of error
- Leads to many invoice disputes





Supplier Adoption Curve






